



Joseph Loy Freeland

June 1, 1949 - March 12, 2019

Joseph Loy Freeland (b. June 1, 1949) passed away on the morning of Tuesday, March 12, 2019, around the time he would have finished up his childhood chores on the dairy farm on Robert's Ridge where he grew up.

He is survived by Debra Gurney Freeland, his wife of 42 years; his children J.W. (Aimee) of Wheeling, WV, and Abby (Carl Grey) of Winston-Salem, NC; his grandchildren Luke, Chelsea, and Josephine; his double cousin Byron Freeland; and his sisters Martha (Les) Fish and Gail (James) Mason. He is the son of the late Loy Woodrow Freeland and Beryl Velma Lancaster Freeland.

Joe was a joyful and generous friend, husband, father, and papa. He loved to make others laugh with a joke or a prank, to tell an outlandish story, and to help solve a problem, whether big or small. He kept his family laughing until the end.

At the age of 23, he opened RMS Hair Stylists, his first business, which he owned and operated for over forty years. His selfless hard work granted his children many opportunities. They are grateful for his sacrifice and support.

Always curious, creative, and savvy, he was an entrepreneur throughout his life, developing real estate and working as a renewable energy and oil and gas consultant for individuals and corporations. He served on the West Virginia Energy Authority Commission and on the West Virginia Infrastructure and Jobs Development Council. He is also the self-proclaimed inventor of pie.

He was a member of the New Martinsville Rotary Club, where he once served as president; St. Vincent de Paul Parish; and Knights of Columbus. In 2010, he was named West Virginian of the Year. He was a faithful breakfast diner at Quinet's Restaurant.

His family will miss his wit, his gentle and calm demeanor, his practical advice, and his

generosity, but they also know his traits run deep within them all because of his powerful influence.

As a charming wordsmith, Joe wrote a poem for every occasion. His family wrote this one for him:

Roses are red,
Violets are blue.
Joe is in heaven now,
No need to boo hoo.

“ The first thing I have always appreciated about Joe was that he was so sharp. Knowing it was an interest of mine, Joe would occasionally talk to me about politics and policy. I remember I was bemoaning some government-funded public-private partnership and, in a few short sentences, Joe completely changed my perspective and opinion on the policy. He had that effect on people. He was smart, but he was also wise. It’s no wonder that Joe was regularly asked to serve on community and business boards and that state and local politicians sought his counsel.

But the most memorable thing about Joe was how much fun he could be. I will always recall a picnic that I attended as a teenager at St Vincent de Paul park. “ Debra, our friendship goes back to our childhood at St. Francis Xavier grade school and Bishop Donahue High School. When we moved to New Martinsville, Joe was one of the first people I met. I'd gone in for a hair trim, and he told me that he was engaged to you. The reconnection with you made the new friendship with Joe an added pleasure.

I have three dear Joe stories....

1. It was around 1984, Juliana was about 5yrs old and she had had an emergency shunt revision in Morgantown . Juli had beautiful thick long blonde hair and the surgeons, as a precaution, parted her hair right down the middle and shaved one half off. They brought me her hair in a plastic bag explaining that they really didn't need to shave it after all. When we got home, there was little Juli shaved completely bald on one side and hair long beyond her shoulder on the other side. I called Joe and he said, "bring Juli right in." He cut the long side and fashioned the biggest comb over in the history of man. We put a beret on her head to hold it in place. Now Juli had a new chin length do, of course, at no charge.

2. Summer 1990 Joe, Deb, Tom and I took a long weekend trip to Cape May/Atlantic City

NJ. We had flown there; we were getting settled in our rooms, and outside Joe drives up in a beautiful white rented convertible. We had such a fun time seeing the sites in that car. Joe had brought a new contraption called a cell phone. It was in a large carrying case, like a small piece of luggage. Joe said, "Everyone's going to have one of these one day..."

3. March 1992. We had lived here in Dayton about a year and a half. I was trying very hard to stay connected to all of our old friends . I was celebrating my 40th birthday, had gone to work. About mid afternoon, the elevator opens and off comes this very over costumed character of a woman, a "bag lady" . She starts yelling and

going desk to desk, looking for me, making all these claims about my past, my numerous marriages, the breast surgery that didn't work, raising such a ruckus. She ended up screeching happy birthday. Of course, later I found out Joe had sent her. He was just trying to make his old friend laugh at her big birthday in a new place. Bless him....

There are going to be so many great Joe stories. Joe loved life and was bigger than life.

How I would love to join you this weekend when Joe is honored, but it is impossible for me to do so. I am chairing a 12 hr Women's Welcome Retreat Day on Saturday with 53 registered to attend. So I will be in the midst of a total day of prayer and reflection throughout Joe's special day. Be assured of my prayers that day and the long days of adjustment that lie ahead. I will be in touch.
