Annalie Jones Pettit, age 94 of Moundsville, WV returned peacefully to her heavenly home on Monday, October 10, 2016.

Annalie was the daughter of the late Bertram and Clara Virginia Hill Jones. She served our country during World War II as an enlisted Medical WAC and was stationed at Ashford General Hospital, which we now know as the Greenbrier in White Sulphur Springs, WV; and she was a respected and loyal employee of Reynolds Memorial Hospital, Glen Dale.

Her faith led her to Simpson United Methodist Church, where she was a devoted member of the choir and hand bell choir; and she also met her husband, Ray Pettit as choir members at Simpson.

Annalie's joys in life were her family, friends, and music. She made Sunday dinners for her ever-growing family every week.
