Broemsen, Herbert E., age 97 of Tenth St., Glen Dale, WV died Sunday, March 9, 2008 in Reynolds Memorial Hospital, Glen Dale.

He was born January 6, 1911 in Moundsville the son of the late John E. and Minda R. Perkins Broemsen.

He was a veteran of WWII, serving in the Army. After discharge from the Army, he attended and graduated from the former Elliott School of Business, Wheeling and was then employed by the Veterans Administration in the Huntington Finance office until 1948; when he was employed by the Treasury Department with positions in Wellsburg and Weirton.

He retired from the Wheeling Office as Supervisor of the Office Collection Force. After retiring from the Treasury Department, he was employed by Dr. Kenneth J. Allen as his office manager. He also taught accounting at the College of Commerce in Wheeling.
