Carol Ann Smith, age 78, of New Martinsville, WV, passed away Sunday, August 4, 2024, at WVU Ruby Memorial Hospital, Morgantown, WV.

She was born December 26, 1945, in Watertown, New York, a daughter of the late Hugo and Theresa Spaziani Galluccio.

She was a 1963 graduate of Watertown High School and graduated from Mohawk Community College with a degree in Advertising & Design. For 28 years she worked for the West Virginia Northern Community College (New Martinsville Campus) as an educational coordinator.
