Kelley, Donald B., age 92 of Moundsville, WV, formerly of Glen Easton, WV died Thursday, April 24, 2014 in Reynolds Memorial Hospital, Glen Dale, WV. He was born August 3, 1921 in Glen Easton, WV the son of the late George W. and Ella J. Cunningham Kelley.

He was a WWII Army Infantry Veteran; a retired foreman from the former Allied Chemical South Plant; a former truck driver, who loved to drive; a Protestant by faith; and a member of Moundsville VFW Post #437.
