April 10, 1931 - October 17, 2013

Fetty, Ellen Virginia, age 82, of Sardis, OH, died Thursday, October 17, 2013 at the Woodsfield Nursing & Rehab Center, Woodsfield, OH.

She was born April 10, 1931 in Sardis, the daughter of the late Orville and Hazel Huffman Bayes.

Ellen was a Methodist by faith and a member of the Monroe County Chapter of Ohio Genealogical Society. She was known for her baking and cooking, and enjoyed embroidering and crossword puzzles.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Luther D. "Luke" Fetty Sr.; and a son-in-law, Delbert Smithberger.
