April 16, 1924 - August 24, 2017

Elwood Sloan, age 93 of Wheeling, WV, formerly of McMechen, WV died Thursday, August 24, 2017 in Wheeling Hospital Medical Park.

He was born April 16, 1924, the son of the late Sam and Iona Niebergall Sloan.

He was a WWII Navy Veteran serving on the Battleship USS Tennessee Catapult Crew; a Christian by faith; owned and operated the former Sloan Sunoco in McMechen; then owned and operated the former Custom Hardware Store in McMechen; and in 1986 he retired from Kennedy Hardware, Wheeling.

He was a member of 40 & 8 Club, American Legion Earl Francis Post #3, Moundsville, VFW Post 3655, McMechen; and was an avid dancer who religiously attended the Friday night dances at the Moundsville Eagles.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, Jane Sloan; three brothers, Ray, Kenny, and Homer Sloan; sister, Margaret Horner; and long-time friend, Marlene Bonar.

Survivors include his son, Ron (Susan) Sloan of Bethlehem, WV; three grandchildren, Erin, Kevin, and Kristin; several nieces and nephews; and two brothers-in-law who were both formerly of Moundsville, John Rogerson of Sanford, NC, and Ed Rogerson of Blue Jay, CA.


