Fetty, Luther D. "Luke" Sr., age 84, of Benwood Road, Sardis, Ohio, died Tuesday, March 6, 2012, at Barnesville Hospital, Barnesville, Ohio.

He was born May 29, 1927 in Warrenton, Ohio, the son of the late George and Bessie Pratt Fetty.

Luke was a WWII veteran, having served in the Sea Bees of the U.S. Navy, and a member of American Legion Post 760, Hannibal. He was retired from Conalco in Hannibal, and was a leader of the Lee Lads and Lassies 4-H Club. He was a member of the Monroe County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogical Society, USWA #5760, and the Conalco Retirees Club, and was a Methodist by faith.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by three brothers, George, McClellan and James Fetty; two sisters, Leota Ogden and Edna Hockenberry; and a son-in-law, Delbert Smithberger.

Survivors include his wife of 62 years, Ellen Bayes Fetty; eight children, Patty (Joe) Fox of Beallsville, OH, Luther "Dave" (Deb) Fetty Jr. of Mt.
