Fritzi Marlene Mueller Manson, 86 of Wheeling, WV died Thursday, December 3, 2020 after a long battle with dementia and Alzheimer's.

She was born January 28, 1934 in Reynolds Memorial Hospital, Glen Dale; the daughter of the late Fritz H. W. and Beulah Hicks Mueller.

She graduated from West Liberty State College and earned a Master's in Education from West Virginia University; she taught many students in Maryland, Virginia, and Marshall County.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by an infant son, John David Manson and a brother, John R. Mueller.

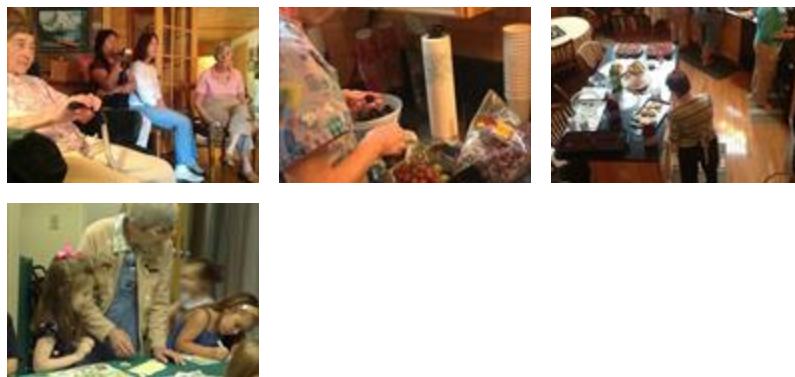
