George Leonard Moore, age 54, of New Martinsville, WV, passed away peacefully in his sleep at home on Sunday, May 22, 2016, after a 10 year battle with cancer.

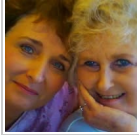

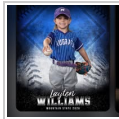
