Kathleen H. Melott, age 95 of Moundsville, WV died Friday, August 24, 2018 in Barnesville Hospital, Barnesville, OH.

She was born February 20, 1923 in Moundsville, the daughter of the late Everett and Jessie Bishop West.

She was a proud homemaker, who up until 3 months ago, did all the work around her house including the painting, and cutting the grass; she also enjoyed sport fishing, polka dancing, and participated in Olympic style weight lifting.
