Travis, Marjorie E., 94, formerly of Moundsville, died Wednesday, March 19, 2014 in Good Shepherd Nursing Home.

She was born August 5, 1919 in Parkersburg, WV, the daughter of the late Charles E. and Jennie M. Wescott Williams.

Marjorie was a member of Calvary United Methodist Church for 72 years and volunteered in a number of capacities. She worked in numerous committees for the church including its Alter Guild, Administrative Board, Membership Committee, and the Building Committee that built the present church in 1956.

She married Harry Travis on August 25, 1940 at Calvary Methodist to continue the family involvement in the church since it began in 1903 when Harry's mother, Laura, joined the church as a charter member.

She was also a former Pythian Sister and Den Mother for the National Trail Council.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband Harry L. Travis and two sisters Helen and Dorothy.
