Roy V. Shreves, 85, of Moundsville, died Saturday, January 21, 2023 in WVU-Reynolds Memorial Hospital.

He was born August 13, 1937 in Sistersville, the son of the late James Arthur and Flossie Belle Rutter Shreves.

Roy graduated Sistersville High School in 1955; he was a PGA golf professional and greens superintendent at Moundsville Country Club for 37 years.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by six brothers, Arthur, Homer, Herbert, Raymond, Bernard, and Eugene Shreves; four sisters, Carolyn Davis, Betty Louise Shreves, Ruth Billiter, Kathaleen Lough.

Survivors include his wife of 58 years, Helen Winters Shreves; one son, Jeff Shreves of Groveport, OH; one daughter, Brenda (Larry) Dobbs of St. Clairsville, OH; one sister, Mary Rea of Sistersville; two grandchildren, Kayla Bopp, Kaitlyn Shreves; numerous nieces and nephews.

The family deeply thanks WVU Reynolds staff and nurses in the ICU for the care given to Roy.

He seemed to understand that everything is harder on the autism spectrum, and it never seemed to bother him. One day, during a particularly frustrated outburst from the perfectionist, Roy turned around to hide his grin. “Ben Hogan,” he said. “I knew Ben Hogan,” and chuckled quietly. It took things like that to pry loose the good stories, because he wouldn’t name-drop even though what he told always turned out to be true (and you could look it up in the newspapers from back when.)

How many people learned the game from him? Likely no one knows, but people who would have quit kept going and came to love the game because of him. Late last summer, Gabe was hitting on the country club range, grumbling in Hoganesque fashion about his swing. Roy happened to be leaving, saw the problem, stopped his truck and went over to point out what had gone wrong. It was the last time we saw him, a fitting send off to a man who couldn’t let somebody go home with a swing flaw if he could fix it. There are no adequate thanks for what he did for Gabe, and all of us.

Oh, and if the country club is still considering a name change, Shreves Memorial Park would be hard to beat.
