Hayes, Todd J. age 46 of Glen Dale, WV died Sunday, December 8, 2013 at home, surrounded by his wife and two friends.

He was born September 5, 1967 in Parkersburg, WV, the son of Paul and Jo Ann Adams Hayes of Wheeling, WV.

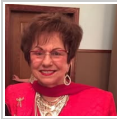
